

## ENTRELAC MITTS



- Project:** Fingerless mitts, with an entrelac colorwork panel on top of hand, stockinette palm and with optional thumb and fingers\*.
- Taught by:** Liz Little
- Description:** 1 x 3hour class and 2 x 2hour classes
- Cost:** \$75 plus materials purchased at The Twisted Knitter
- Dates:** Sunday, August 21<sup>st</sup> – 1 to 4pm (Entrelac panel)  
Sunday, September 4<sup>th</sup> – 1 to 3pm (Palm panel)  
Sunday, September 18<sup>th</sup> – 1 to 3pm (Finishing with optional thumb and fingers).

**Skills Needed:** Confident beginner, keen to learn a fun colorwork technique!

### Skills Learned:

- Working with two colors and joining-in new colors
- Picking up edge stitches
- Left and right sloping decreases
- Knitting through the back loop
- Following a knitting diagram
- Working in the round (optional)
- Seaming and finishing techniques

### Materials needed:

- A small amount of short color changing, fingering weight yarn with a contrast or coordinating solid color for palm and wrist. It's an ideal opportunity to use mini skeins!
- A set of fingering weight double pointed needles (eg. US 2/2.75mm)
- Small point protectors, darning needle
- Basic panel instructions are included with the class. \*More advanced knitters may choose to follow the Reservoir Mitts pattern by Allyson Dykhuizen.
