

Sock It Two Me!



Do you suffer from **SSS? Second Sock Syndrome** - It is the problem created when you finish one sock and just can't seem to ever get the second sock done or even on the needles! Come learn how fast socks can be finished and on your feet using two circular needles.

Skills Needed:

- Basic knitting skills
- Knitting in the round

Skills Learned:

- Toe up Sock Construction
- Knitting 2 socks at a time
- Afterthought heel
- Judy's Magic Cast On
- Jeny's Surprisingly Stretchy Bind Off
- Making a foot template

Materials Needed:

- 2 skeins Lang yarns Jawoll Twin for self-stripping socks or approximately 390 yards of Fingering Weight Yarn.
- (2) US 1 / 1.25 mm 16-24 inch circular needles or size needed to obtain gauge
- Stitch Markers
- Tapestry needle.
- Pattern provided in class.

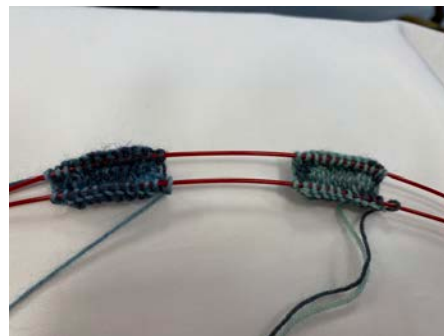
Preparation:

Pre-purchase yarn and needles and swatch as follows:

1. Cast on 50 stitches onto your circular needle.
2. Knit 3 rows
3. Then, instead of turning the work around so you can purl the next row, keep the front of the work facing you and SLIDE it down the needle to the other end. The working yarn is now coming from the left side of the knitting.
4. Bring the yarn from the left end to the right end, leave a very loose loop of yarn behind the work and knit the row. Then, without turning the work, slide the stitches to the right end of the needle.
5. Bring the yarn from the left, leave a big loop of slack, and purl 5 stitches, knit 21 stitches, purl 5 stitches. Then, without turning the work, slide the stitches to the right end of the needle.
6. Repeat steps 4 and 5 for about 4.5 inches. Do not cut the yarn. Leave your sts on the needles, measure gauge – write it down and then block your swatch and measure your gauge again – and write it down. You need 32 stitches = 4". If you need help with your gauge, bring your swatch into the shop and we will help you figure it out.
